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INAUGURATION OF CAPE COAST TECHNICAL UNIVERSITY GOVERNING COUNCIL



he Minister for Education, Dr. Yaw Osei Adutwum, on Tuesday, February 22, 2022 inaugurated an 18-member governing Council for Cape Coast Technical University during a short ceremony at the Ministry of Education in Accra. Preceding the administration of the Oath of Secrecy by the Minister for Education, the Chief Director at the Ministry of Education, indicated that the appointment was in accordance with section 5 of the Technical Universities Act (922) which states that "the Council shall be the governing body of the University" and that the following persons present for the inauguration have been appointed as such.



The Honourable Minister for Education, Dr. Yaw Osei Adutwum, administered the Oath of Secrecy and reiterated that the Council was appointed by the President in consultation with the Council of State and is mandated to steer the affairs of the university by providing strategic leadership, guidance and direction. In his remarks, the Honourable Minister for Education, commended the Council on their appointment and requested them to bring their expertise to bear on the development and the delivering of the Cape Coast Technical University mandate. He further indicated that members must be guided by the Oath of Secrecy in all their dealings and information that needed to be communicated must come from the Office mandated to do so. He remarked that if they really wanted to see Cape Cast Technical University as one of the best Technical Universities in Ghana and beyond then members should eschew issues that create divisions since such things greatly affect development and progress of any institution. He categorically stated that the Government and for that



matter the Ministry of Education is not interested in petty politics in the Council but rather interested to see Cape Coast Technical University becoming the best in its category.

The Honourable Minister for Education, Dr. Yaw Osei Adutwum stressed that the role of the Technical Universities in the country is unique. The Technical Unversities serve as catalyst for growth and development and that explains why the government is really committed to the development of the Technical Universities in Ghana. He opined that Cape Coast Technical University has to tell her stories for the world to know the achievements and capabilities and it is by this that the Government and donor agencies would come on board to help. He intimated that he had no doubt in his mind that when all efforts are strategically geared towards the goals of Cape Coast Technical University, the industrialization agenda of the country as well as the University becoming the innovation hub and centre of excellence would be achieved. The Minister for Education, Dr. Yaw Osei Adutwum further challenged Cape Coast Technical University to strategically put in place mechanisms to attract the best of students and also increase the student population. He was grateful that the Chairman of Council (Rev. Prof. Harold S. Amoono Kuofi), the Vice-Chancellor (Rt. Rev. Ing. Prof. J. D. Owusu-Sekvere) and the Registrar (Dr. Francis Narh Akrono) were still in the seat.



Rev. Prof. Harold S. Amoono Kuofi, the Chairman of Council for the newly inaugurated Cape Coast Technical University Governing Council, responded on behalf of the Council Members and expressed his appreciation for the trust and confidence reposed in them by the Government to serve and contribute to the development of Cape Coast Technical University. In his remarks, Rev. Prof. Harold S. Amoono Kuofi, pledged on behalf of the members to do their utmost best within the mandated period so as to address the issues of the University. He indicated that CCTU needed to be repositioned to address the requisite technical manpower of the nation and that the Council was poised to work in unity to achieve it.



The Chairman of Council added that the Council would prioritize its efforts to increase student population as well as bring on board industry driven demand programmes that would exhume positive public image. He further stated that as a Technical University of choice they would collaborate with the Honourable Minister for Education so that goals of CCTU and by extension the government would be achieved. He further stated that expertise of every member on the Governing Council would be harnessed to work together with the leadership of the University to bring significant progress.

Rev. Prof. Harold S. Amoono Kuofi, the Chairman of Council expressed his utmost gratitude and boundless joy to the President and the Minister for Education for the investment that were being made at CCTU and that they would do their best to uplift the image

of CCTU. On that note, Rev. Prof. Harold S. Amoono Kuofi, the Chairman of Council accepted his appointment as the Chairman of Council and indicated that he would carry out his role with utmost integrity.

ape Coast Technical University had its 18th Congregation ceremony on Saturday March 5, 2022 at the ceremonial grounds on the University premises. The ceremony was colourful and very eventful. The event saw the presence of high profiled dignitaries who travelled far and near to come and grace the occasion. Notable amongst them were the Honourable Deputy Minister of Education, Mrs. Gifty Twum Ampofo, Hon. Dr. Kwamena Minta-Nyarku, MP for Cape Coast North, Hon. Ernest Arthur and Cape Coast Metropolitan Chief Executive and the Archbishop of Cape Coast Metropolitan Catholic Diocese (Charles Palmer-Buckle). Others were the Governing Council members, and Pro-Vice Chancellor from Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology, Kumasi. A total number of 946 students who completed their programmes of study in Degree, Higher National Diploma, Professional Diploma and Diploma programmes in 2021 were presented at the ceremony. Out of this number, 185 graduated with Bachelor of Technology, 475 were awarded Higher National Diploma and 286 obtained Professional Diploma and Diploma

certificates. A number of students who distinguished themselves in various disciplines were honoured.



The overall best graduating student was a student in the Department of the Electrical/Electronic Engineering and School of Engineering. He was in the person of Mr. Kato Maxwell Kumah. He received the Professor Samuel Ato Duncan Special Award.



EXCERPTS FROM THE SPEECH OF HONOURABLE DEPUTY MINISTER OF EDUCATION, MRS. GIFTY TWUM AMPOFO



It is gratifying, ladies and gentlemen, to state that all the TVET Institutions now captured under the Ghana TVET Service have been included in the next academic year's (April 2022) Computerized School Selection and Placement System (CSSPS) for selection by the Junior High School graduates to enjoy the Government's flagship programme "FREE TVET/SHS FOR ALL". There is also the opportunity for those who complete their TVET programmes to continue from the National Proficiency levels through Certificate levels to HND, B.TECH, M.TECH to the Doctor of Technology level with the National TVET Qualifications Framework (NTVETQF), which is being implemented by the Commission for TVET.

In addition, government has rolled out the pre-engineering programme for secondary school graduates with non-science backgrounds. The Pre-Engineering programme is a one-year detailed course designed to prepare and train secondary school graduates with non-science backgrounds for enrollment into Bachelor of Science in Engineering course at the university. It is exciting to know that the Pre-Engineering programme is a game changer that will open doors to many non-science secondary school graduates, especially Visual Arts graduates who have the desire and possess the ability and creative mind to be trained as the innovative and creative engineers to drive Industrialization in our dear country.

This Pre-Engineering programme is in accordance with the Education Strategic Plan 2018-2030 which targets a 60% enrollment of stu-

dents in tertiary education enrolled in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) disciplines.

I have been informed that the AVIC project, a project that will serve a multi-faceted purpose for CCTU, forms part of the measures to enhance the practical nature of Higher Technical and Vocational Education Training programmes being offered in the University. The laboratory of the AVIC project has the full complement of modern workshops and laboratories for Civil, Mechanical and Electrical/ Electronic Engineering to offer practical training to students in soil, concrete, bitumen and aggregate testing; welding, automobile, maintenance and repair, CCNC milling, fabrication and building of transistors; and electrical drive system, electronic workshop and electrical/ electronic power system respectively.

I must also congratulate the Management of CCTU and workers of AVIC holding cooperation that despite the initial setbacks faced as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the project has been completed.



Finally, ladies and gentlemen, let me once again say Ayekooo!!! to all our fresh graduates and wish to emphasise how privileged I am to witness this day with you. Go out there and shine forth as true ambassadors of Cape Coast Technical University. Congratulations!!! God bless you all.

CCTU COUNSELLING UNIT ORGANISES STUDY HABIT SEMINAR FOR THE STUDENTS



The Counselling Unit of Cape Coast Technical University has been organizing Study Habit Seminar to assist students to develop healthy habits towards their academic work on departmental basis. The Head of the Counselling Unit, Dr. Mrs. Esther Boham in his opening remarks indicated that students often arrive ill-prepared for studying at university where teaching regularly takes place in large class sizes, where students are taught by staff who are involved in a variety of other roles in addition to teaching, and where the emphasis is on independent learning. She further said studies by Murtagh, 2010 indicated that the transition from the highly controlled, teacher-driven learning environment of high schools to university, where the student is responsible for their own learning, is perhaps the biggest challenge for the first year students.

At the Seminar students were taken through ten (10) sections of the Study Habit Profile, namely allotment of time, assignment, concentration, consultation, corrections, procedure in study, reading and library use, written works and taking examinations. Dr. Mrs. Boham explained to the students what time allotment means, the courses that need much focus to getting the best and also advised them on how efficient and effective their time should be used other than spending time on seemingly unnec-



essary things as well as do their assignment on time. She further said some of the students are easily attracted to their phones, television and other activities such as chatting (WhatsApp, Facebook etc.). They advised them to avoid things that would distract them when studying because the purpose for being on campus was to study and acquire knowledge. Dr. Mrs. Boham advised them to consult their friends when they don't understand some aspect of a lecture and indicated it was more shameful to consult a friend in an examination room which amounts to examination malpractice.



The speaker said the students should do further reading or studying beyond what the lecturer gives to them. They were further encouraged to plan whatever they want to study and try answering questions after the end of every chapter or a section of a book they read. Students were advised to often visit the library and developed a habit of going to the library. Regarding examination, the students were encouraged to prepare very well before going to the examination center as well as plan out their points properly to answer questions in an examination. Students were then made to complete an inventory and they were taken through the scoring and interpretation. In the end they became aware of the areas they needed to work on.

In her concluding remarks, Dr. Mrs. Boham, recommended that, students should let the primary purpose of coming to the university be the driving force and helping them to get the best out of it. They should also respect one another and encouraged them to live a responsible life on campus.

The Vice-Chancellor remarked that such gestures are not to be taken lightly and for that matter the presence of CCTU on their premises was an ample evidence of how CCTU cherished the donation and would also like to deepen such friendship for mutual benefit. He further intimated that the visit was also to see how best CCTU could collaborate with COA RML to help CCTU do what it does better and vice-versa. The Chief Executive Officer (C.E.O.) of COA RML (Prof Samuel Ato Duncan) on his part expressed his profound gratitude to the Vice-Chancellor and his team for the visit as well as familiarizing themselves with production processes of the COA Mixture of which they could be good ambassadors of the product. He indicated that Cape Coast Technical University being a science and technology institution in the central region would be the best institution to collaborate with. He believed the collaboration in the area of research would help take the plant medicine through an advance scientific research which would be accepted by the international level. He further mentioned that the new site for the production of the medicine would be a fully automated structure and that lapses identified

In his response to availability of the COA Mixture on the international market, the C.E.O. indicated that the product is in countries like Dubai, United States of America, United Kingdom, South Africa, Tanzania and other countries. He further said it could also be obtained on amazon.com. On that note, he extended invitation to the leadership of CCTU and the entire university community on the launching of the company's strategic plan among other things on the 10th of April, 2022 at the University of Cape Coast.

The Deputy C. E. O. (Nana Ohemeng Awire) on behalf of the C.E.O. presented three boxes of the COA Mixture to the Vice-Chancellor and the delegation. The Registrar (Dr. Francis Narh Akrono) on behalf of the delegation and the University community expressed his profound gratitude to the C.E.O. and his team for the presentation and requested for the blessings of the almighty God to protect and guide them in all their endeavours.
